RE: MPO BOARD DIRECTIVES + IIJA UPDATE + STAFF REPORT

This memorandum updates the Board and Technical Committee on the board directives, the 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act's programs, and summarizes DCHC MPO Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) tasks.

#### 1. MPO BOARD DIRECTIVES

11-4-20	Develop a strategy to move forward on the 15/501 Corridor Study that addresses concerns about bicycle and pedestrian treatments along the corridor as well as additional outreach to local stakeholders.	Underway. Scope developed. Switching gears; once the Durham bike/ped plan, Bus Speed and Reliability Study, and Safe Streets for All projects are underway, we will initiate procurement for the study. The caveat is that we must amend the work program AFTER a preferred vendor and draft project budget is negotiated.
10-13-21	Investigate potential options for a racial equity policy and/or framework for DCHC MPO.	Pending. Staff will investigate options and present them to the TC and Board as a part of the 2023-24 UPWP Public Involvement Program update. Current focus on report improvements and engagement diversity.
12-15-21	Investigate the possibility of conducting a highway safety plan or other options for improving highway safety within the MPO.	Underway. Working with FHWA on grant agreement. Reassignment to CPRC is complete.
4-13-22	Staff should address outstanding items regarding the Triangle Regional Model TRM and work with the TRM team at ITRE to address those concerns. Staff should report back to the Board in spring 2023.	Underway. ITRE provided follow up discussion for using the TRM to evaluate non-motorized projects. Staff will ask ITRE to present evaluation options at an upcoming TC meeting. We are also working to better use the model as a decision-making tool focused around MTP goals and objectives.
5-11-22	Develop a set of specific recommendations for the legislative delegation to consider based on the DCHC-CAMPO adopted policy priorities for the 2023 General Assembly session.	Underway. Adopted in February including increase to one (1) cent local option sales tax. Prioritization continues. Will coordinate with CPRC to engage legislators in advance of 2024 short session.

#### 2. INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENTS AND JOBS ACT INFORMATION

On November 6, 2021, Congress passed the Bipartisan Infrastructure Deal (Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act) (IIJA), a once-in-a-generation investment in national infrastructure and competitiveness. Among the IIJA's goals are several transportation-related investments in electric vehicles and infrastructure, passenger rail, airports and ports, public transit, and roads and bridges.

The funding for these programs will be distributed by state through formula grants and competitive grants, each with their own timeline and application requirements. This standing memo seeks to update the MPO Board and DCHC MPO jurisdictions regularly to grant and funding opportunities as they arise.
