6. <u>2055 Metropolitan Transportation Plan Schedule and Public Engagement Plan (10</u> minutes)

The DCHC MPO adopted the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) in February 2022. Federal rules require that the MPO adopt an updated plan within five years in air quality attainment areas and every four years in non-attainment or maintenance areas. DCHC MPO and the Capital Area MPO partner to create a single MTP and are both part of the Triangle Region, which is currently an air quality attainment area. However, a 2018 court case has required ozone attainment areas to continue to demonstrate conformity through the year 2027. Therefore, the 2055 MTP must be adopted no later than February 2026 and follow the four-year update cycle. The first step in developing the updated MTP is to identify the schedule and public engagement plan.

Draft 2055 MTP Schedule Overview:

- November 2023 Begin public engagement.
- · February 2024 Approve goals and objectives.
- May 2024 Approve performance measures.
- · July 2024 Begin alternatives analysis and deficiency analysis.
- · February 2025 Review deficiency analysis.
- June 2025 Approve alternatives analysis and begin engagement on preferred option.
- · August 2025 Review preferred option.
- · October 2025 Approve Air Quality (AQ) conformity analysis.
- · November 2025 Adopt 2055 MTP.

Attached is a *detailed* draft schedule for the adoption of the 2055 MTP.

The public engagement plan is also attached and is labeled "Destination 2055," which will be the campaign name this cycle.

The request today is for approval of use of the MTP public engagement plan. As the MTP process is a lengthy one, this plan is subject to change based on the needs as determined by the engagement itself. Engagement efforts are consistent with the MPO's Public Involvement Plan (PIP).

8. <u>Amendment #1 to the FY2024-2033 Transportation Improvement</u> <u>Program (TIP)</u>

Amendment #1 to the FY2024-2033 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) includes the addition of funding to existing projects as well as adding new projects from the FY24 Call for Projects. The amendment also includes carryover adjustments from FY2020-2029 TIP Amendments 6, 9, 13, 14, 15, and 16. These amendments were already approved by the Board in previous meetings and are reissued for administrative purposes to reconcile data between the old and new plans, ensuring a more seamless transition into the State TIP (STIP).

Additional projects in this amendment include Item N updates from NCDOT (state provided amendments and modifications), and other such project updates that fall under administrative modifications. Two projects from the Item N are <u>not</u> being amended into the TIP at this time as they are not in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP); they are HN-0013 Erwin Road turn lanes, and HN-0014 Cornwallis Road turn lanes.

9. <u>Update Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) Boundary and Adjusted</u> (Smoothed) US Census Urban Area (UA) Boundary Doug Plachcinski, AICP, CFM, DCHC MPO Executive Director

The MPO is responsible for defining the Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA), which includes land area that is anticipated to be urban in nature within the next 20 years. This requires approval by the MPO and NCDOT.

The MPO is also responsible for developing an adjusted (smoothed) Urban Area. The adjusted (smoothed) UA boundary is reviewed and approved by NCDOT and FHWA. Per the Estimated Schedule of Activities, the adjusted (smoothed) UA boundary for each MPO is due in its entirety (MPO, NCDOT, and FHWA) by December 29, 2023. The adjusted (smoothed) UA boundary must be included in the MPA.

The MPO has updated the MPA Boundary and Adjusted (Smoothed) US Census Urban Area Boundary. The resulting map(s) will be provided as an attachment and shared at the TC meeting.

NCDOT encourages MPOs to adopt the MPAs at the same time as the adjusted (smoothed) UAs.

TC Action: Approved the Metropolitan Planning Area Boundary and Adjusted (Smoothed) US Census Urban Area (UA) Boundary with the boundary being snapped to the blocked group on the map.

Board Action: Recommend MPO Board approval of the Metropolitan Planning Area Boundary and Adjusted (Smoothed) US Census Urban Area Boundary.

10. <u>2024 DCHC MPO Meeting Calendar (5 minutes)</u> Kelly Fomenko, MPO Staff

Attached is the proposed meeting calendar for the DCHC MPO Technical Committee and Board. This includes an adjustment to the typical meeting schedule for Technical Committee meetings and Board meetings. With this new schedule, Technical Committee meetings occur on the 2nd Tuesday of the month and Board meetings occur on the 4th Tuesday of the month, with the following exceptions:

-July & December: No Technical Committee or Board meetings -November: The Board will meet on the third Tuesday to accommodate the Thanksgiving holiday

Previously, Technical Committee meetings have been held on the 4th Wednesday of the month, and Board meetings have been held on the 2nd Wednesday of the month. The 2024 Proposed Meeting schedule will improve efficiency in coordination with the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT), while also avoiding standing meeting conflicts that occur for some of the MPO member jurisdictions. For example, Board meetings at the end of the month allow Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) amendments to be submitted for the 1st of the following month, which is the NCDOT deadline. The proposed schedule will also enable better regional coordination with partner Capital Area MPO (CAMPO) with whom DCHC MPO shares their Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP).

If there are conflicts with these meeting times, staff will work to address this prior to presenting again at the November TC and December Board meetings. If this schedule is accepted, the December TC can be cancelled as the new schedule will establish an early January meeting of the TC.

The Technical Committee reviewed the 2024 meeting calendar and requested consideration of alternate dates. A survey was sent out to staff members on alternate technical committee dates. MPO staff are requesting the Board review the 2024 meeting calendar and provide feedback.
