5. <u>FFY 2025 5339 Full Apportionment for Durham NC UZA</u> Thomas Porter, Triangle West TPO

The Section 5339 Buses and Bus Facilities Program makes federal resources available to states and designated recipients to replace, rehabilitate, and purchase buses and related equipment, and to construct bus-related facilities. Triangle West TPO is the designated recipient for the Durham urbanized area (UZA). Section 5339 formula funds are allocated to the urbanized areas (UZAs) based upon population, vehicle revenue miles, and passenger miles. For FFY 2025, the Durham UZA was awarded a full apportionment of \$918,731. As the designated recipient for 5339 funds for the Durham UZA, the Triangle West TPO may allocate funding to fixed-route operators. The recommended distribution of this funding was developed in consultation with the four fixed-route transit operators and MPO policy. A 'split letter' to FTA regarding the allocation of these funds among transit operators must be approved by the Board to authorize the transit operators to seek applications for funding. Attached is the split letter to FTA for the Board Chair's signature.

The North Carolina Board of Transportation is expected to adopt the FY2026-2035 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) at their July meeting. In order to implement the program, the TPO Board is required to adopt the Triangle West Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP). The STIP and the TIP must match for the first four years of the program.

Per the TPO's Public Participation Plan, the TIP must be released for a 30-day public comment period and a public hearing will take at the August TPO Board meeting. Once adopted, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) will review the STIP and TIP to ensure conformity. Once that review is complete, the FY2026-2035 TIP will go into effect.

The draft TIP is attached for your review.

Included with this item is the Air Quality Conformity Determination Report (AQ CDR) for the Draft TIP/STIP. This report demonstrates that certain pollutant emissions from the future transportation sector will not exceed a specified threshold. It is required to be ran with any adopted MTIP or with any amendment to the MTP.

10. <u>SPOT 8.0 Public Release of Project List (10 minutes)</u> Filmon Fishastion, TPO Staff

The Strategic Prioritization of Transportation (SPOT) process is a data-driven approach for ranking projects across North Carolina. Projects are scored based on mode of transportation, degree of impact (statewide, regional, division), and other critical factors. This process takes several years and determines the prioritization of projects in a future funding cycle. This upcoming SPOT cycle is the 8th iteration of the scoring process and projects will be funded for the FY2028-2037 STIP.

Earlier this year, members were asked to submit requests for projects that have not already competed in a SPOT cycle in the past. This list of new submissions have been added to the list of Holding Tank projects (submissions from P7.0 that were not selected for funding) and the list of projects that were considered for submission in P7.0 that ultimately did not make the list of submissions. This combined list of all projects being considered for P8.0 will go out for public comment in the month of July.

A subcommittee of the TC will meet in August to narrow the list of projects to the final recommend list .The final recommended list will take into consideration the comments received, the project scores from P7.0, and local priorities.
