# MPO BOARD DIRECTIVES

November 4, 2020	Develop a strategy to move forward on the 15/501 Corridor Study that addresses concerns about bicycle and pedestrian treatments along the corridor as well as additional outreach to local stakeholders.	Underway. Draft scope under development. Project will also incorporate MTP performance measures driven by public input; similar approach as US 70 east project. We anticipate launching the next phase of US 70 work then pivoting to 15-501 with a similar approach at the beginning of the new fiscal year.
May 11, 2022	Develop a set of specific recommendations for the legislative delegation to consider based on potential consideration for the 2025 General Assembly session.	Underway. We will reexamine; engaging NCDOT for agency priorities in 2025. As part of strategic planning, Fountain Works will provide steps for developing legislative relationships and sharing information with MPO Board members. Additionally we attended an AMPO DC fly in for legislative week; met with NC delegation and staff to listen to their priorities around reauthorization.

# II – A – 1 Networks and Support Systems

- 1. Vehicle Miles of Travel
  - ✓ Potential local development traffic impact analysis tool for regional VMT.
- 2. Street System Changes
  - ✓ Our team will work with NCDOT as they update the National Functional Classification designation for our MPO planning area. Additional modeling updates for MTP scenario analysis including preferred scenario.
- 3. Traffic Crashes and Safety Data
  - ✓ SS4A adopted; working with partners on potential grant applications.
- 4. Central Area Parking Inventory
  - ✓ Supporting Hillsborough Downtown Parking Study. Data collection and public outreach moving forward.

  - ✓ Permanent counter battery replacement underway.

- 7. Capacity Deficiency Analysis- alternatives complete, moving forward with preferred alternative design while collecting public input.

#### II - A - 2 Travelers and Behavior

 Dwelling Unit, Population, and Employment Changes, Base Year Data Collection, Travel Surveys, Vehicle Occupancy Rates, Travel Time Studies, Annual Continuous Travel Behavior Surveys (Household Survey).

# III – A – 3 Transportation Modeling

- Travel Regional Model Enhancements, latest version successfully deployed.
- Horizon Year Data Forecasts Gearing up for alternatives analysis. Financial Planning initial
  conversations about fiscal constraint for 2055 MTP pending. We will present up to three options
  with the MTP including state, federal, and local financial resources. The TC and Board should
  prepare to affirm a one (1) cent sales tax increase on top of the current half (1/2) cent sales tax.
- Developing internal capacity to use VisionEval. <u>VisionEval</u> is a collaborative project to build a family of strategic tools for performance-based transportation planning into a single open-

source programming framework. Strategic tools are designed to evaluate many alternative futures and policies to address pressing issues, despite uncertainty. Unfortunately, current FHWA resource uncertainty paused further VisionEval development for the time being.

#### II - B - 1: Targeted Planning

Congestion Mitigation Plan adopted. We will apply the methodology during MTP alternatives
analysis. Expect a workshop discussion in February-March. Applying CMP process and data to US
70 phase II as part of study process. CMP implementation incorporated into MTP scenarios.
Developing approaches for 15-501 analysis.

# II - B - 2: Regional Planning

- Metropolitan Transportation Plan Goal and Objectives engagement completed, working through alternatives analysis development based on public and board feedback. Held virtual open house
- Comprehensive Transportation Plan Preparing the schedule for the update in conjunction with MTP update. Met with Durham to understand public involvement expectations and how the community uses CTP in their development ordinances. Subcommittee established initial working discussions with NCDOT regarding models.

# II – B – 3: Special Studies

- Durham Freeway Corridor Study waiting for local partner updates
- Durham County US 70 Corridor Study Phase II procurement process in contract negotiations.
   Reached out to Leesville Road Coalition to discuss transportation focused virtual town hall.
   Refining scope with direction from NCDOT Feasibility Studies Unit.
- Durham-to-Roxboro Rail Trail Feasibility Study Ongoing public input and existing conditions analysis.. Next steps include analyzing public survey response and establishing the trail's name and branding.
- Durham City/County Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan second round public engagement activities being planned for May. Phase 1 survey results being analyzed, and comprehensive network being developed.
- Hillsborough Parking Study first round public engagement activities being planned for April/May, including a survey and events.
- Strategic Rail Plan working through strategy prioritization based on critical path implementation. Next step is to review concepts with NCDOT Rail Division prior to reconvening steering committee.
- Chapel Hill Transit High Capacity Selected vendor in contract negotiations.

#### III - A. Unified Planning Work Program

#### III-A-1: Unified Planning Work Program

• 2026-2027 UPWP development targeted from draft completion by September. We will rebuild our budgeting spreadsheets with updated numbers and processes. Expect a different task element layout that connects to our (currently under draft) strategic plan.

#### III-A-2: Metrics and Performance Measures

Will crosswalk draft 25-26 UPWP with MTP goals and strategic planning outcomes before
formal submission to FHWA/FTA through NCDOT. Internal working sessions with Fountain
Works to process retreat outcomes and prepare draft strategic planning deliverables.
