10. Amendment #2 to the FY2024-2033 Transportation Improvement

Program (TIP) (5 Minutes)

Amendment #2 to the FY2024-33 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) adds \$2 million in 5339 funding and local fund match to the Chapel Hill Transit Facility Expansion. TIP Amendment #2 also adds a vehicle purchase of two 40-feet buses for GoTriangle and updates the funding for several projects.

As there are projects with changes in excess of \$2 million and 25% from the original amount, per the MPO's Public Involvement Plan (PIP), this amendment was released for a 21-day public comment period. The current timeline for adoption is as follows:

- March 12: TC recommended Board release for public comment
- March 26: Board released for public comment
- April 9: TC recommended Board approves amendment
- April 23: Board approves amendment

As of April 16, 2024 one comment was received for this public comment period.

11. FY2025 Call for Projects Recommendation (20 Minutes)

The Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) invited member agencies to submit applications for federal funding from the Regional Flexible Funding (RFF) in November 2023. Funding applications were due on December 8, 2023.

The RFF pool for FY25 consists of four funding sources that come directly to the DCHC MPO: Surface Transportation Block Grant Direct Attributable (BGDA), Transportation Alternatives Program Direct Attributable (TAPDA), Carbon Reduction Program Direct Attributable (CRPDA), and Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ). The call for projects that was conducted by MPO staff is consistent with federal requirements for CMAQ and TAPDA funds, and can be applied to all funding sources.

The public comment period for the list of projects to be funded ends on Thursday, April 18, 2024. The public comments received as of April 11, 2024 are included in the attachments. Any additional comments received will be presented at the Board meeting on April 23, 2024.

A memo detailing the amount of available funding, project scores, and the next steps can be found in the attachments.

Note that the public comment period had not been completed at the time of the TC recommendation
