8. <u>DCHC MPO Technical Committee Officer Election</u> Colleen McGue, MPO Planning Manager

Per Article IV Section 2 of the TC bylaws, officers are to be elected every year at the first meeting of the calendar year. Officers may serve up to two consecutive terms in their respective positions. Nish Trivedi is completing his first year as the Chair and Ellen Beckmann is completing her first year as Vice Chair.

At the October 25, 2023 TC Meeting, the board recommended Nish Trivedi as Chair for a second term and Ellen Beckmann as Vice Chair for a second term. The elections period has closed and the installation will take place at the Tuesday, January 09, 2024 TC meeting.

TC Action: Vote and install 2024 Chair and Vice Chair.

9. <u>Targets for Safety Performance Measures (20 minutes)</u> David Miller, MPO Staff Brian Murphy, NCDOT Traffic Safety Unit

Per federal statute, MPOs must adopt targets for safety performance measures. MPOs may either agree to support the targets developed by the state, or they may develop and adopt their own. The MPO must adopt the safety performance measures by February 27, 2024. Brian Murphy, Traffic Safety Systems Engineer from NCDOT's Traffic Safety Unit, will provide an overview of the safety performance measures and share safety data specific to the DCHC MPO urbanized area. MPO staff recommends supporting the state's safety targets by resolution. The attached resolution includes NCDOT's safety performance measure targets, and the attached presentation provides additional background and information.

TC Action: Recommend that the DCHC MPO Board adopt the resolution that supports the state's safety targets.

10. <u>FY2025 Call for Projects Recommendation & Release for Public</u> <u>Comment (20 Minutes)</u> Filmon Fishastion, MPO Staff

The Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) invited member agencies to submit applications for federal funding from the Regional Flexible Funding (RFF) in November 2023. Funding applications were due on December 8, 2023.

The RFF pool for FY25 consists of four funding sources that come directly to the DCHC MPO: Surface Transportation Block Grant Direct Attributable (BGDA), Transportation Alternatives Program Direct Attributable (TAPDA), Carbon Reduction Program Direct Attributable (CRPDA), and Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ). The call for projects that was conducted by MPO staff is consistent with federal requirements for CMAQ and TAPDA funds, and can be applied to all funding sources.

A memo detailing the amount of available funding, scores, and the next steps can be found in the attachment.

Three scenarios are provided for discussion during the meeting. Staff are seeking TC recommendation of a preferred scenario for funding, which will be provided to the MPO Board prior to release for public comment.

TC Action: Recommend that the MPO Board release the proposed projects to be funded through the FY25 Call for Projects for a 21-day public comment period.

11. <u>Amendment #1 to the FY2024-2033 Transportation Improvement</u> <u>Program (TIP)</u> Filmon Fishastion, MPO Staff

Amendment #1 to the FY2024-2033 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) includes the addition of funding to existing projects as well as adding new projects from the FY24 Call for Projects. The amendment also includes carryover adjustments from FY2020-2029 TIP Amendments 6, 9, 13, 14, 15, and 16. These amendments were already approved by the Board in previous meetings and are reissued for administrative purposes to reconcile data between the old and new plans, ensuring a more seamless transition into the State TIP (STIP).

Additional projects in this amendment include Item N updates from NCDOT (state provided amendments and modifications), and other such project updates that fall under administrative modifications. Two projects from the Item N are <u>not</u> being amended into the TIP at this time as they are not in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP); they are HN-0013 Erwin Road turn lanes, and HN-0014 Cornwallis Road turn lanes.

Public input is currently being accepted for Amendment #1 until Friday, January 19, 2024.

The DCHC MPO is required by federal regulations to prepare an annual Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) that details and guides the urban area transportation planning activities. Funding for the UPWP is provided by the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration. The UPWP must identify MPO planning tasks to be performed with the use of federal transportation funds.

13. <u>Destination 2055 Goals and Objectives Engagement Updates (20</u> <u>minutes)</u> Kelly Fomenko, MPO Staff Andy Henry, MPO Staff

The 2055 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is the long-range transportation plan that covers the Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) and the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) regional boundaries. This plan is updated every four years and this update is being led with the campaign name of "Destination 2055". The update of this plan is extensive and generally takes two years to complete. Engagement is guided through a Public Engagement Strategy which was approved for use by both MPO Boards in late 2023.

The first engagement phase for Destination 2055 starts with the visioning process, which looks at the goals and objectives of the plan. The goals and objectives survey was publicly released on November 16, 2023 and will close on January 10, 2024. There will be a public hearing at the CAMPO Board meeting on January 17 and at the DCHC MPO Board meeting on January 23, prior to the joint CAMPO and DCHC MPO Board meeting to occur on January 31.

Other engagement efforts included: pop-up events at Durham Station, the Boxyard, and the Regional Transit Center; newspaper advertisements in the Triangle Tribunal, Que Pasa, and the News & Observer; and direct outreach to community groups.

 - o <u>88</u> Survey-Takers Who Provided Comments (281 total comments)
- <u>314</u> Survey Takers Who Responded to Demographic Questions (97% of total)
 - o <u>33</u> Low Income Household, Under \$53,000 Per Year (11% of responses)
 - o <u>33</u> Identifies as Minority (11% of responses)
 - o <u>16</u> Identifies as Hispanic, Latino, and Spanish (5% of responses)
 - o <u>13</u> Zero Car Household (4% of responses)
