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## 88 ACTION ITEMS: 89 90 8. Triangle West TPO Draft Regional Safety Action Plan **Colleen McGue, TPO Planning Manager** 91 Jared Draper, Toole Design 92 93 Colleen McGue shared that over the past nine months, the Triangle West TPO has been in the 94 process of developing a regional safety action plan to improve transit, pedestrian/bicyclist and highway 95 96 safety throughout the Triangle West planning area. The draft Vision Zero Safety Action Plan includes a 97 snapshot of the crash types, severities, and locations and identifies strategies for improving overall safety in the region. This draft plan is the result of the data analysis, community engagement, and stakeholder 98 discussions that have taken place over the course of this planning effort. Jared Draper presented the draft 99 100 Safety Action Plan and shared next steps, which will include partnering with member agencies and 101 community-based organizations around the region to host public workshops and pop-up events throughout the months of March and early April to share the draft plan with the community. The comments 102 103 received and discussions at these engagement events will be reviewed and incorporated into the draft 104 plan during the public comment period. A motion was made by Nish Trivedi to recommend that the MPO Board release the draft Triangle 105 West TPO Safety Action Plan for public comment and was seconded by Aaron Cain. The motion passed 106 107 unanimously. 108 109 INFORMATONAL ITEMS: 110 9. Draft 2026-2035 State Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) Update 111 Filmon Fishastion, TPO Staff 112 113

114 Filmon Fishastion presented on the draft 2026-2035 STIP that was released on January 29, 2025. 115 This draft includes new projects that were recently awarded funding from the Statewide Strategic Prioritization 7.0 Cycle. Due to limited funding availability, new projects were selected for funding in only 116 117 four Strategic Transportation Investment (STI) categories: Statewide Mobility, Regions C and D, and 118 Division 6. Triangle West TPO did receive funding for new projects, and TPO staff are working closely with 119 NCDOT to understand schedule changes that are affecting existing projects in the draft STIP. Filmon 120 Fishastion outlined those in his presentation. NCDOT has been running a public comment period from January 31 to April 4, 2025 with drop in 121 122 sessions between February 17 and March 17, 2025. The final STIP is expected to be adopted in July 123 2025. Several TC members raised questions about STIP project cost increases. Becca Gallas from 124 Division 5 shared some details regarding the overall project cost increases in the STIP. Mr. Fishastion also shared that the development of the recently funded bus rapid transit projects in the Triangle West 125 126 area is under way, and there are discussions happening amongst the transit providers in the region about 127 the details of these projects.

## 10. <u>FY2025 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Administrative Modification #1</u> Thomas Porter, TPO Staff 130

131 Thomas Porter updated the TC on Administrative Modification #1 information to the FY2025 132 UPWP. Thomas Porter explained that the Local Project Delivery Study was programmed into the FY2025 UPWP for \$100,000 (20% local match of \$20,000 and 80% STBG-DA funds of \$80,000). Triangle West 133 134 requested funding for this study to support its members in advancing and delivering local projects. Since 135 the study was programmed, Triangle West was awarded a competitive grant from the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Prioritization Process Pilot Program (PPPP) to pursue project delivery support. 136 137 Procurement for the PPPP grant project is underway, and the \$100,000 for the project that is programmed in the UPWP is no longer needed to pursue this effort. 138

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139	Thomas Porter clarified that Triangle West will be moving the \$100,000 in approved funds from	
140	this study and shifting it to the Durham City/County Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan special study and US 70	
141	East Corridor Study: Phase II.
