Over **\$2.3B is expected to be available** in the Building Infrastructure in Communities (BRIC) grant program and another \$800M in the Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) grant program. This can be for shovel-ready construction projects that mitigate the risk of a natural hazard to public infrastructure or plans and studies to help develop future projects (called Capabilities & Capacity Building or C&CB proposals).

The first step is to submit the LOI (see attached instructions).

After the LOI panel review, technical assistance in preparing these applications may be available from a variety of sources. FEMA has aligned these funds with the <u>JUSTICE40 Initiative</u>, directing 40% to benefit disadvantaged communities.


