6. <u>US 70 East Corridor Study Phase 1 Final Report Presentation (20</u> minutes)

The US 70 East Corridor Study is a planning study that was pursued to propose a safe, efficient, and equitable multimodal transportation system that offers a choice between public transit, pedestrian and bicycle use, and automobile travel. The study area is a 4-mile stretch along the US 70 corridor from I-885 to the future Northern Durham Parkway (near the Wake County border). Originally an NCDOT road widening project (STIP U-5720) that was included in the MPO's 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), a delay in STIP funding for U-5720 presented an opportunity to explore and study alternatives that would consider multimodal transportation options along the corridor in conjunction with the MPO Policy Board's removal of all future road widening projects from its 2050 MTP.

The US 70 East Corridor study was programmed in the MPO's FY2022 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), and it commenced in July 2022. STV was selected as the prime consultant, and Aidilisms was selected as the subconsultant to lead public engagement efforts.

The study team will present a brief background of the study and second round of public engagement, the two concepts it developed and presented to the public during public engagement efforts, and provide details of the second phase of this study. The presentation, phase 1 final report and appendices, and summary of the second round of public engagement have been included as supporting documentation.

7. <u>Amendment #2 to the FY2024-2033 Transportation Improvement</u> <u>Program (TIP) (5 minutes)</u> Filmon Fishastion, MPO Staff

Amendment #2 to the FY2024-33 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) adds \$2 million in 5339 funding and local fund match to the Chapel Hill Transit Facility Expansion. TIP Amendment #2 also adds a vehicle purchase of two 40-feet buses for GoTriangle and updates the funding for several projects.

As there are projects with changes in excess of \$2 million and 25% from the original amount, per the MPO's Public Involvement Plan (PIP), this amendment will be released for a 21-day public comment period. The current timeline for adoption is as follows:

- March 12: TC recommends Board release for public comment
- March 26: Board releases for public comment
- April 9: TC recommends Board approves amendment
- April 30: Board approves amendment

8. <u>FY2025 Call for Projects Recommendation & Release for Public</u> <u>Comment (20 Minutes)</u> Filmon Fishastion, MPO Staff

The Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) invited member agencies to submit applications for federal funding from the Regional Flexible Funding (RFF) in November 2023. Funding applications were due on December 8, 2023.

The RFF pool for FY25 consists of four funding sources that come directly to the DCHC MPO: Surface Transportation Block Grant Direct Attributable (BGDA), Transportation Alternatives Program Direct Attributable (TAPDA), Carbon Reduction Program Direct Attributable (CRPDA), and Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ). The call for projects that was conducted by MPO staff is consistent with federal requirements for CMAQ and TAPDA funds, and can be applied to all funding sources.

A memo detailing the amount of available funding, scores, and the next steps can be found in the attachment.

9. <u>FY2025 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Approval (10 minutes)</u> Doug Plachcinski, MPO Staff

The DCHC MPO is required by federal regulation to prepare an annual Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) that details and guides the urban area transportation planning activities. Funding for the UPWP is provided by the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration. The UPWP must identify MPO planning tasks to be performed with the use of federal transportation funds.

The MPO Board released the Draft FY2025 UPWP for public comment on January 23. A public hearing was held at the February 27 Board meeting. No comments from the public were provided at the meeting.

The remaining schedule for the UPWP development process is as follows:

- March 12: TC receives the final UPWP and recommends the Board approve the FY2025 UPWP.

- March 26: MPO Board approves the final FY2025 UPWP.

- March 28: MPO submits approved UPWP to NCDOT.

The Final Draft FY2025 UPWP, public comments received as of February 20th, and the full development schedule is included as information.

11. <u>Status Report on Locally Administered Projects (LAP) (10 Minutes)</u> Colleen McGue, MPO Planning Manager

In October 2023 the DCHC MPO Board adopted an update to the DCHC MPO Federal Funding Policy, which guides the distribution of federal funds that flow through the MPO for local projects, such as Surface Transportation Black Grant Direct Attributable (STBGDA), Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ), and Carbon Reduction Program (CRP). By applying for federal funding for a project through the MPO's program, the applicant is committing to locally managing that project. The sponsor is responsible for all federal and state reporting requirements associated with the funding source applied to their project, as well as MPO reporting requirements.

The DCHC MPO Federal Funding Policy states that recipients of federal funding will provide a brief report on the status of their locally administered projects (LAP) to the MPO Board twice a year. The attached information will form the basis of the first report for FY24, which will be provided to the MPO Board at their March meeting. The second FY 24 report will be provided to the MPO Board at their June 2024 meeting.

The draft FY 2025 UPWP includes a Local Project Delivery Study, which is intended to assist our MPO, in partnership with our local jurisdictions, with obligating and delivering projects in our MPO area. A consultant will be procured to conduct interviews with relevant stakeholders, (NCDOT, our local jurisdictions, and MPO staff) to learn about current challenges and opportunities, and produce recommendations for improving our federal funding process and LAP program. A desired of this study is project benchmarking, web dashboards, and improved project sponsor update opportunities.
